The 124th Annual Encampment of the Ohio Department of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War was held at Mount Union College in Alliance, Ohio June 16-18, 2006.

The Allied Orders of the Grand Army of the Republic were also present and consisted of; The Auxiliary of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War; The Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic; The Woman's Relief Corps; and the Daughters of Union Veterans 1861-1865. All meetings were held on the campus of Mount Union College in separate buildings due to the on-going renovation at the Hoover-Price Building.

Registration began on Friday June 16, 2006, with PCinC Richard Greenwalt, Sites Committee Chairman and PNP Ladies Auxiliary Bea Greenwalt handling these duties.

Dinner was served at 5:00 p.m. followed by the Campfire Program at 7:00 p.m.

The only business held on June 16, 2006 was an auditing of the Treasurer's records by the Department Council. All records were deemed to be correct.

Saturday June 17, 2006

A Joint Opening with the Ladies of the Auxiliary began at approximately 9:00 a.m. in the cafeteria room. Pleasantries were exchanged and Gavels were presented to each of the Presiding Officers with each wishing the other success during their annual Encampments.

The Ohio officers and delegates then retired to their meeting room to begin the business session.

Department Commander Nagel opened the Encampment in due form, The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Color Guard Kirby Bauman. Department Chaplain Howard T. Frost, PDC, said the opening prayer. The Encampment was opened in due form.

Department Commander Ray Nagel introduced dignitaries to the Encampment; Donald E. Darby, Commander-in-Chief; Past Commanders-in-Chief Ed Krieser, Robert Grim, Dick Greenwalt, and Charles Corfman. Past Department Commanders; Donald E. Darby, Terry Frost, Brad Tilton, Dick Greenwalt, Charles Corfman, Jon Silvis, Robert Grim, Dave Medert, Jim Houston.

Commander Nagel then thanked his officers and additional thanks went to David V. Medert, PDC; Henry Shaw, PCC and personal aide Jim Houston, PDC.

Resolutions committee was appointed to PDC Brad Tilton. Officer's reports to PDC Jon Silvis.

Officers Reports

Department Commander Nagel turned the gavel over to Senior Vice Commander Ken Freshley and began his report:

"July 16th I attended two wreath laying ceremonies at Buffington Island. The first at 11:00 am by Brooks-Grant Camp #7 and the LGAR McCook Circle; the second at 4:00 p.m. with the Fearing Camp, Cadot-Blessing Camp and the 91st OVI. I laid the Department wreath at both Ceremonies.

August 4th, 5th and 6th 2005 I attended the National Encampment in Nashua, New Hampshire, where Don Darby was elected Commander-in-Chief and the Banning Camp was awarded the Abraham Lincoln Award for being the most outstanding Camp in the nation. The Banning Camp as you may not know are in Mount Vernon they got 15 members in that camp and they were picked over all nation-wide as the most outstanding Camp in the Nation.

August 13th 2005, I took the Abraham Lincoln Award to the Banning Camp and presented it at the Daniel Emmet Music Festival in Mount Vernon, Ohio.

August 20th, 2005, I attended the Battery Hooper and Dr. Ramage Museum grand Opening in Fort Wright, Kentucky.

August 30th, 2005, Mailed letters to each senator and House member concerning Buffington Island encouraging them to join the Civil War Battlefield preservation Caucus also asking support for adding training camps and prisons to the preservation efforts. I did this because someone put forth a resolution that I do that and I followed through.

I participated in the Labor Day Parade on September 4 in Canal Winchester, Ohio.

September 18th, General Lytle anniversary of his death ceremony at Spring Grove Cemetery.

September 19th I received a call from Senator Voinovich's office on the letter above regarding the Battlefield Caucus. There is none on the Senate side at this time; however, Senator Jim Jeffords of Vermont is considering starting one on the Senate. Senator Voinovich's aide assured me he would do everything he could to preserve Buffington Island and his aides would remind him if the Senate forms a similar caucus on the Senate side.

September 20th, 2005, I attended the Valentin Keller Camp meeting in Fairfield, Ohio

October 1st, 2005, attended the Department Council meeting at the Red Brick Tavern in Lafayette, Ohio.

October 18th I attended the Richard Enderlin Camp meeting in Chillicothe, Ohio.

October 29th attended the re-dedication of the Sheridan statue in Somerset, Ohio.

November 5th, I attended the U.S. Colored Troops Reunion at the HOLIDAY INN in Dayton Ohio. We were up there trying to recruit, myself, Ken Freshley, Jim Houston, and Henry Shaw was all up there. I think Ken was up there all weekend, weren't you? Jim and I were only there for a day.

January 7th, Installation of Officers at the Lytle Camp

January 10th, Installed officers at the McPherson Camp in Genoa, Ohio

January 12th, I attended a meeting and installed the officers at the Dennison Camp #1 in Columbus Ohio.

January 14th, we held a special meeting to change Department by-laws, which was followed, by the mid-winter meeting in Columbus.

January 17th, I installed the Samuel A. Gilbert Camp # 5 and officers in Springfield, Ohio.

January 28th, I installed the officers of the Private Valentin Keller Camp # 8 in Fairfield, Ohio.

February 16th, attended the Lincoln Day Diner in Covington, Kentucky.

March 21st, I attended another Enderlin Camp meeting in Chillicothe.

April 1st, Attended a program on noted Civil War burials in Greenlawn Cemetery, Columbus, Ohio. Which was hosted by Dennison Camp #1

April 22nd, attended U.S. Grant's birthday celebration in Point Pleasant, Ohio

May 11th, I presented the ROTC Award and medal to an ROTC student from Great Oaks School in Cincinnati.

May 15th, dedication of the plaque honoring the last Civil War Veteran that died and was buried in Clermont County, Ohio.

May 30th, Attended Memorial Day service at Spring Grove Cemetery, Cincinnati, Ohio

I have attended all of my Camp meetings except one, which was missed due to car trouble.

My recommendations for 2006 are concerning Buffington Island. **I recommend that the Department of Ohio Sanction, as in one of my General Orders, General Order**

#1, only one Buffington Island Ceremony involving two or more Camps that are from the Ohio Department in order to clear up the confusion and embarrassment resulting from the Ohio Department being involved in two separate ceremonies on the same date and involving several different Camps. The Camps involved in any joint ceremony at Buffington Island will be authorized to place upon any flyers or any material involved in that years' event the following:

"Sanctioned by the Department of Ohio Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War."

If there were a single Camp involved there would be no sanction. The Buffington Island Representative is to report at the Mid-Winter Meeting on the Camps involved in working together on this ceremony. I would also recommend that the Department help with the publicity for this event and provide funds to the Camps involved and the Portland Historical Society Museum in order to make it something the Department can be proud of, recognizing Ohio's Civil War Battlefield. This year they would like, if we could, make a donation of \$150.00 this will allow them to serve refreshments to everyone that comes down there and they keep the excess as a donation to their museum.

Another thing that I recommend, Recommendation number two we need a Department Encampment Guide Booklet of some sort. We only do this; we are the host of the Encampment every four or five years. Everybody forgets what we are doing, if we would work together with the other Allied Orders and have it in writing in a booklet that we can put on-line maybe we could download where "this group does this, this group does that, this is the line-up for the Joint Opening and so forth it would make things go a lot smoother. Because poor Bob Davis and Jim Houston were running around trying to figure out what we do, when we do it and how, through this whole time. I just feel that if we had some sort of guide that would help us out. It would sure make things a lot easier.

The thing, Recommendation number three, I recommend that we also buy a new Department Flag. The flag we have, I mean to me, looks a little worse for wear. I recommend that we get a new flag that the Department can be proud of. Respectfully submitted. Ray Nagel.

Senior Vice Commander Report, Ken Freshley, PCC:

The Senior Vice Commander's report is listed in the back of these Proceedings. There were some items in the spoken report that are not contained in his written report. Those items are listed here.

I received one request on April 1st, 2006 for \$1,024 from Brother Grim of Camp #92 for the restoration of a Civil War Memorial at Washington Cemetery. Commander appointed myself, Brother Tilton, Brother Houston and Brother Frost as the Monuments and Memorials Committee. The Committee approved their request via email due to the short time frame on April 15th, 2006.

Senior Vice Commander Freshley also reported on his positions as Junior Vice Commander and Signals Officer. Those reports are located at the end of these proceedings.

Secretary/Treasurer David V. Medert, PDC made his report. (Located in the back of these Proceedings.)

Patriotic Instructor Christopher Greene made his report. (Located in the back of these Proceedings).

Chief of Staff Bob Davis made his report. (Located in the back of these Proceedings).

Graves Registrations Ken Dorr made his report. Brother Door gave a verbal report. “ Commander, brothers, basically this is my second year as Graves Registrations officer of the Department. Since the mid-winter meeting in January we have registered at least 1,500 graves in the active database. That only leaves a backlog of 10,000. I would like to note that we lost Brother Mike Trowbridge. I would like to report that I received all of the data he had been working on. I would like to report that over the past several months I have made contact with representatives from Muskingum County, Hardin County. I also have made contact with Genealogical County in Cuyahoga County to undertake assisting us in registering graves in Cuyahoga County. Hopefully with their help we can add close to 5,000. We are currently at about 47,000 Ohio Graves that have been added to the National database.

Commander Nagel stated that he was remiss is announcing another guest, Bob Petrovic from the Department of Missouri and Ron Gill from the Department of Indiana.

Memorials Officer Don Grant made his report. (Located at the back of these Proceedings.)

GAR Records Officer Chuck Greene made his report. (Located in the back of these Proceedings).

Ohio Veterans Ohio Officer Jon Silvis submitted his report. Located at the back of these Proceedings.

Commander Nagel reminded everyone that next year is the 125th Anniversary. We had appointed the 2006 Department Encampment Medal Committee. He then asked if they had anything to report.

Brother Tim Graham explained the design of the 125th Ohio Department SUVCW Medal. Audiotape was unable to pick up all of Brother Graham’s explanation. It did however; pick up Brother David V. Medert’s recommendation that the Committee put forth a recommendation after lunch as to the design of the medal and to have it presented at that time. The recommendation was accepted and the report ended.

Eagle Scout Coordinator Brad Tilton made his report. (See back of these Proceedings.)

Brother David V. Medert asked if since the medal has the SUVCW logo on it do we have to get permission from National to use it. Commander-in-Chief Darby stated that if the Department wished to sell this medal to members outside of the Order they would have to get permission to use the logo. Brother Graham and the Committee were informed of requirement.

Department Chaplain Howard Terry Frost stated that he had submitted his written report. (Located in the back of this Proceedings)

Discussion was continued regarding the removal of flags requirement made by some cemeteries. It was decided that the local cemeteries make the rules regarding how long flags remain on the graves

Buffington Island Representative Scott Britton made his report. (Located in the back of these Proceedings)

Commander Nagel then had the Department Secretary read the Resolutions to be passed on to Brother Brad Tilton. (Located at the end of these Proceedings).

Meeting adjourned until 1:15 p.m. as Commander Nagel stated that it was his intent to beat Don Darby's record for shortest Encampment.

Meeting resumed at 1:15 p.m.

Audiotape starts late. But the Department Commander asks Commander-in-Chief Darby to address the Encampment.

Commander-in-Chief Darby presented the members of the Encampment with State list of all the SUVCW Camps that have been in Ohio since 1882.

He then began his address:

He mentioned the three items that would be coming before the National Encampment

Which would require a change to the Constitution and Regulations. 1st was a change in wording that would, if accepted by the Encampment and approved by 50% Department, Would make the SUVCW at 501(C) 3 entity. The 2nd was a change that would speed up the getting new members from National into Camps. 3rd was the change to the way National will handle the ROTC Medal and applications for it.

There have been 10 new Camps at National, 690 new members and a Department renamed. A one minute and a 30 second audio CD have been made available to Camps so that they can place on the Public Radio Service of their local radio stations.

James Houston gave the Auditor's Report. (See back of Proceedings)

James Houston then gave the Real Sons Report (See back of Proceedings)

Bob Davis gave the Camp Chase Report and the Chief of Staff Fund. (See back of these Proceedings).

Resolutions Committee Reported on the Resolutions they had received.

Resolution # 1

Support movement of Civil War Pension Files to the National Archives.

Recommendation of the Committee is to NOT support the recommendation.

As there was not discussion or object the resolution was NOT supported at the sound of the gavel.

Resolution # 2

To support "In God We Trust" on U.S. Coinage.

Recommendation of the Committee was NO ACTION as there was not enough information provided on the Constitution Restoration Act. No House Bill or Senate Bill Number was provided.

As there was no discussion or object the Committee recommendation for NO ACTION was approved at the sound of the gavel.

Resolution #3

Support of Crosses on Federal Monuments

Recommendation of the Committee was recommend Support.

As there was no discussion or objection the resolution was approved as supported at the sound of the gavel.

Resolution #4

Support for David V. Medert as a candidate for Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief.

Committee after much discussion, recommended support

As there was no discussion or object the resolution was approved as supported at the sound of the gavel.

Jon Silvis, PDC, presented officers Reports.

Department Commander's Report Recommendations

Sanctioning the Buffington Island event.

Committee supported the sanctioning of the event and concurred with the \$150.00 amount to be provided.

Recommendation was approved without objection at the sound of the gavel.

Department Encampment Guide Book

Committee concurs with this recommendation.

Recommendation was approved without discussion or objection at the sound of the gavel.

Department Colors (Flag)

Committee concurs with the recommendation to purchase new Department Flag

The James A. Garfield Camp stated that they would be happy to contribute \$100.00 toward the new flag.

Following this discussion the recommendation was approved without objection and at the sound of the gavel.

Department Patriotic Instructor's Report Recommendations

Department and Camp Patriotic Instructors follow the National Reporting Process.

Committee concurs.

Approved at the sound of the gavel.

Department Patriotic Instructor should attempt to meet or discuss with Camp Patriotic Instructors concerning the Camps the Adopt-a-School Program

Committee Concurs

Approved at the sound of the gavel.

The Department Patriotic Instructor should assist the Department Junior Vice in preparing recruiting materials.

Committee concurs

Approved at the sound of the gavel.

Department Patriotic Instructor should prepare articles to appear in the Department Newsletter.

Committee concurs with support from the Camp Patriotic Instructors.

Approved at the sound of the gavel.

Buffington Island Representative Report Recommendations

A request of assistance for a 34-star 3 x 5 U.S. Flag from Buffington Island.

Committee Concurs

Approved at the sound of the gavel.

Chaplain Report recommendations

Place a flag at the gravesite of a veteran.

Committee concurs

Approved at the sound of the gavel.

Eagle Scout Coordinator Report Recommendations:

Reimbursement of money spend for Eagle Scout Program in the form of \$104.81

Committee concurs.

Approved at the sound of the gavel.

Money to come out of the General Fund.

Ohio Veterans Home Report Recommendations:

Creation of a 501(C)3 Fund for the Ohio Veterans Home.

David V. Medert moved that this be researched and report back on at the next Department Encampment.

Robert Grim seconded.

Discussion followed regarding clarification as if this was an SUVCW issue, it was affirmed by Brother Jon Silvis as being such.

Motion was approved.

End of Officers reports.

Brother Tim Graham then verbally described the 125th Ohio Department SUVCW Medal.

It will have the seal of Ohio and will say the Department of Ohio. Red Ribbon. \$9.00 per medal. David V. Medert stated that Herman Werks made a medal for the SVR for \$2.50 per medal as a consideration. Discussion was also brought up that including the SUVCW logo on the medal would require the approval of the Nation Council of Administration, which would take time. Bob Petrovic stated that if a drawing were taken to Herman Werks it would take 3-4 months to make a medal. The question was raised about buying the medal from China.

15-minute recess was called.

Brother Graham and his committee returned with a replica of the 125th Encampment Medal that was passed around. No SUVCW logo on the Medal. Price is still \$9.00.

It will have the Seal of Ohio with 125th Encampment Ohio SUVCW.

Motion: The Committee has designed the Medal with the Encampment's approval; we will strike 250 medals at \$9.00a piece, total expenditure not to exceed \$2,250.

Second.

Motion carried.

Question by Brother David V. Medert. These are going to be put for sale to anyone attending the Encampment next year, right? What is the sale price going be? Who is going to decide that sale price? Is the Department Council going to decide?

Commander-in-Chief Darby stated that the Council would have to decide because the vote won't be taken until the medal is needed. So it would fall to the Department Council. Brother Medert stated that he would like to see that the people who come to the

Encampment, the Sons only, that it is given to them. We have only got 23 people here anyway, anyone else that wants one will have to purchase one. Further discussion followed. Brother Frost stated that he was cheap and if he could get one for free then he would take that.

PCinC Corfman brought up the 2003 National Encampment where the medals were sold to the Allied Orders and all the trouble that that caused. Brother Medert stated “this is the 125th Encampment of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War not the Woman’s Relief Corps or the Ladies of the GAR, its for the men, its OUR 125th. That is all that I want to say.”

New Business.

The Commander-in-Chief was asked to leave the room. C-in-C Darby stated “Boy, make you Commander-in-Chief and they throw you out of your own Department.”

Brother David Medert brought up the idea to purchase a SUVCW sword with the Commander-in-Chief’s name on it for less than \$500. That he was not asking for \$500 as Don wasn’t worth \$5.00. He asked if the Department would be interested in donating some money toward this gift. Discussion followed. Motion was made for the Department of Ohio to pay up to \$500.00 toward the sword. The motion was seconded. Motion approved.

Bob Davis to allow he to represent the Ohio Department Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War for a large plaque of General Logan’s General Order 11, which was cast in the 1940’s to get it, placed in the Ohio State House. Motion made and seconded. Motion passed.

Brother Tim Graham then passed around his raffle tickets and explained how then worked to raise money for the Garfield Camp and the Camps that sold them.

A Motion was made, seconded and passed to permit Brother Graham to produce an Ohio Delegate ribbon and badge for the National Encampment.

Terry Frost made the motion and it was seconded to donate \$50.00 to the National Chief of Staff Fund. Seconded. Motion passed.

Terry Frost made a motion that the Ohio Department takes a full-page ad in the Encampment book. \$40.00 motion made, seconded and passed.

Brad Tilton made the motion that \$35.00 by paid for a table at the Ohio Genealogical Convention in Columbus. Seconded, Motion passed.

Election of Officers.

Commander-in-Chief Don Darby made the motion that if there is only one member nominated for the position that the Department Secretary cast a single vote in favor of the nominee and at the sound of the gavel the Brother is elected. Motion carried

Hello Mr. Grant,

I have been researching my 3G GF, George B. PAGE, and was preparing to enter him onto a national site, I believe, when I found out someone else had another George Page listed with my 3G GF's military service. Since then for the past couple of weeks, I've gone over everything I have and made sure my info is correct. (and also with a small amount of time located correct data for this other George Page.)

RE: my George B. Page...

I do know there is a tombstone in W. Rushville Cem with George and his wife (my 3G GM) listed and a flag was flying when I visited there a couple of years ago.

Now, for my predicament...my 3G GF, died March 13-16, 1872 near LaDue, Henry Co, Missouri. He served in 148th OH Nat'l Guard Co "C" & 13th OH Cav Vol Inf Co "B". After the CW he moved his family to Henry Co, MO where he was a blacksmith until his death at age 39. They are listed in 1870 Fed Census, Grand River Twp, Clinton PO.

I am perplexed as to his burial.

On Susan's (my 3G GM) tombstone in W. Rushville Cem, Fairfield Co, OH is listed her husband, George B. Page. I had always thought he was buried there with her and only now doubt that for several reasons. (probably/possibly their adult children wanted to commemorate him when their mother died & added his name to the tombstone)

1. She was buried in 1929 in the 'new' section. George died 57 years earlier in 1872; and if he were buried there, it would have been the 'older' section.
2. According to some probate papers (from Henry Co, MO) that I have, it looks like Susan kept articles from his estate that would lead me to believe they stayed in Henry Co. and farmed (at least for a while) after his death. (However, by 1875 and 1877 the two oldest daughters were married in Fairfield Co, OH. I suspect Susan was there too with the other children. They were in OH for 1880 census.)

My assumption is George is buried near Clinton, MO where they lived, but I don't have any proof. Do you have a way to find out who has the records of burials for West Rushville Cem. so we can find out if he is buried there or not? I have tried posting to the Fairfield Co Rootsweb list and received responses, but get 'cemetery transcription' information and not burial records.

I hope you can help me with this challenge. Any other information you need, I'll be happy to help share with you. Thank you very much for taking your time with this worthwhile project of Graves Registrations for the Veterans!

GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC POST RECORDS REPORT

My initial report of January 14, 2006 at the Mid Winter Meeting stated that I had identified 14 public, private and university libraries that posses GAR records, publications and memorabilia and that these libraries are located in Ohio's largest cities.

Today I am pleased to report that I have identified 35 GAR Posts who have records in one or more of those libraries. There are 53 separate library files relating to these 35 Posts. I am including a list of those Posts and the respective item in each library and also including a computer printout of each item with its description and library call number.

These records are by no measure complete and each covers a limited number of years. Their contents range from membership lists, minutes of meetings, by-laws, Post histories and "records". An individual search of each would be needed to determine exactly what is contained in each file.

This is the breakdown by library. Ohio Historical has 25 Posts and 39 collections, Western Reserve has five Posts and five collections, Dayton-Metro has three Posts and three collections, Akron-Summit has one Post and three collections, Toledo-Lucas has one Post and one collection and the Clinton County Historical has one Post and one collection. At this time it appears that the Clinton County collection is the most complete. They have the Morris McMillan Post #58 meeting minutes, dues records, financial reports, death records and a death roll for all years 1884 to 1934.

As my January report stated many of the libraries have the GAR Ohio Annual Encampment Proceedings which list the active Posts, officers, delegates and death roll for the previous year. The Ohio Historical Library has a complete set of these documents and the Toledo-Lucas County has

almost a complete set. These documents can be used to determine the start of a Post and over the years it is possible to put together a roster of members and officers.

The continuation of this study suggests two questions. First, what will happen to the data collected to this point? I will attempt to add this data to the National Web site but should something be done at a Department level? Second, should we continue to research all remaining county libraries, county historical and genealogical societies and private collections?

At the 2006 Mid Winter Meeting the question arose "What do I do with the GAR records and data in my personal possession?" Presumably that was a reference to the disposition of personal GAR data so that it would not end up on E-Bay or some similar location.

That question was considered previously by the members of the Ohio SUVCW. I refer you to SUVCW Department of Ohio By Laws, Article 7 Committees, Section 1, Paragraph 3, Committee on Historical Trust. "The duty of this Committee is to seek a workable agreement for the temporary and/or permanent loan of Civil War, G.A.R. and similar historic artifacts, relics, etc. with the Ohio Historical Society and to continually seek donations for preservation. This committee shall consist of at least three(3) members with the Department Historian serving as Chairman. Members are asked to list personal donations in their wills with the Committee on Historical Trust as the beneficiary."

I urge all Brothers who possess any GAR records, publications or memorabilia to give serious thought to our existing By Law and if any Brother is aware of the location of any GAR Post records to make such information available.

As always, it has been an honor and privilege to serve you. There have been many exciting things going on at the Ohio Veterans Home (Sandusky) this past year.

Wearing several hats in my capacity as the Ohio Veterans Home Representative. We have forged many long term and hopefully lasting ties to the Ohio Veterans Home. As you are aware the OVH was founded in 1886 to house Civil War Veterans. This is now a 99 acre monument to the Civil War Veteran and in particular the Allied Orders of the GAR. All of them (Us) are represented around the grounds.

There are six (6) sandstone cottages of Richardsonian Romanesque architecture approximately 5000 square feet per cottage. As well as a museum housed in the original Administration Building. Each of these cottages is vacant and begging for some use that might conform to veterans affairs. To that end, the administration of the home has ASKED FOR OUR ASSISTANCE IN DEVELOPING THE PRESENT MUSEUM AND FINDING USES FOR THESE COTTAGES. I ask you... Where is Ohio's museum to her sons (and daughters) and their sacrifices? ... It does not exist... This facility is open to the public, operated by Ohio's veterans, for Ohio's veterans. We have an open invitation to hold meetings, encampments, SVR events, Re-enactments, historical weekends either by ourselves or in conjunction with any other military society or organization that you can think of. They are inviting us to take a front row seat in this development. A seat at the BOARD TABLE in the development of the public private partnership so desperately needed.

To that end, the following has been a part of my endeavors thus far this year since we have last met:

Continued the relationship between the OVH and the SUVCW Charitable Foundation, officially headquartered at the OVH. (My sincere thanks to our National Leadership and the foundation board for their continued support)

Continued efforts to organize and incorporate a Not-for-Profit, federally recognized 501-C-3 Corporation. The Ohio Military Heritage Association.

Successfully completed with the help of my home camp (Garfield 142) in landing the United Spanish War Veterans and their Affiliated Orders as a tenant. They have presently on the table, at my urging, development of their own 501-C-3, Not-for-Profit, tentatively entitled "The United Spanish War Veterans National Headquarters Museum and Archives". This should be completed by our encampment in August.

My home camp has been assisting the Sons of Spanish War Veterans, The Daughters of 98, and the USWV Auxilliary in the creation of this museum thru cataloging, preservation and display of these artifacts and memorabilia.\

Continued support to the Johnson's Island Preservation Society (JIPS) in their museum housed at the OVH Museum.

With the help of Past Camp Commander Waffler (formerly Philip Triem Camp) assisted in the donation of all 128 volumes of the Official Records of the Civil War to the OVH Museum library. (YOUR Library... OUR Library..., Access to the OR's or the Ohio Rosters, 1812 thru WWI, anytime you want, for a phone call or an e-mail away....FREE!)

Hosted, with the help of Bro. Chris Greene, a gentleman and his wife who toured the OVH grounds and the cottages about the extensive possibilities there. This gentleman is very involved in foundation grants and monies and has assured us of his support.

Lent support and assistance to an event to be held on the grounds of the OVH on September 23rd and 24th in a trial run to see if we can host future events at the OVH in support of its historical mission. (Flyers are available)

Many of you might recall the midwinter meeting, when I believe, Bro. Hilton raised the question of what we should be doing with our archives and memorabilia that we as Brothers, Camps and a Department have acquired. Some camps have become repositories of many records and artifacts of

GAR, Sons of Veterans or SUVCW nature. Recognizing that we as an organization are not in the museum business, we are however, in the archives business, with this in mind, and with the knowledge that we have been invited to assist in the development of the historical side of the OVH by the administration, I contend it is time for us to commit to an ideal for a more noble and greater cause..

I therefore propose we consider the following:

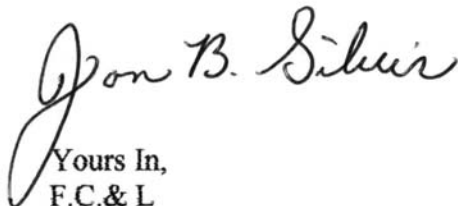
- 1.) Creation of our own 501-C-3, Not-for-Profit corporation, to possibly be called {The Department of Ohio, Grand Army of the Republic, Museum and Archives} or { The Ohio Civil War Museum}.

Incorporating our own museum and archives allows the Ohio Department to maintain control and ownership of the relics, and memorabilia, which we have acquired. It is expected that these archives will be made available to serious researchers and historians of the civil war as codified in our corporate purpose.

- 2.) Re-evaluate Ohio Department Bylaws, specifically Article VII, Section 1. Committee on Historical Trust to see how it might relate to this proposal.

There is a great deal of work, legal, financial and just plain "ole" fashion sweat equity involved. But, the chance to have a permanent archives and home for the Allied Orders of the Department of Ohio, and a chance to help save a part of this historic home is a lasting legacy to our forefathers... A more Noble and Greater Cause...

Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War

Commander Nagel & Fellow Brothers,

It has been an honor to serve as the Buffington Island Representative for the Ohio Department over the past year. I want to thank Commander Nagel in particular for the confidence you placed in me with this position, your support and attendance of last year's Buffington Island wreath-laying ceremony, and your patience and understanding with my medical issues during the past six months.

On Saturday, July 16, 2005 at 2:00pm, I conducted the wreath-laying ceremony during the Buffington Island Reenactment at the state park in Portland, OH. I gave a short speech honoring the Union men who fought at Buffington Island and participated in the pursuit of Gen. John Hunt Morgan's Raiders. A representative of the SCV also gave a short, appropriate speech to honor the men in gray who were killed during the battle. Following the laying of wreaths at the battlefield monument by the Ohio Department SUVCW and the SCV, a group of Confederate and Union re-enactors, standing at right angles to one another, fired a rifle salute to the fallen. With lightning striking nearby, the ceremony was quickly concluded.

During the past year there have been a number of developments regarding the preservation of the Buffington Island battlefield and expanding opportunities that are being developed to educate the public about this historic Civil War site. Gray & Pape Consultants of Cincinnati, OH, the Ohio Historical Society and others have held a series of meetings to develop a comprehensive strategic plan for the battlefield area. Their preliminary report will be sent to the Department Secretary for inclusion in the record. I attended the first of three meetings last fall to discuss these plans. Due to scheduling conflicts and medical problems, I was unable to attend the two subsequent meetings. A fourth meeting is planned in the near future, but is still unscheduled at this time.

I want to report that The Shelly Company who own a large amount of the original battlefield land, and who has been at the heart of much controversy in recent years concerning mining of this land, has been working with local groups to improve the community. They donated all materials to pave the driveway at the former Portland Elementary School, site of the future Buffington Island Civil War Museum, and a helipad there to assist in emergency life flight services to the area. They have also been in touch with the Museum and will possibly be donating some artifacts discovered during the Heidelberg College archeological survey of the battlefield a number of years ago. This is a positive development for both sides in this tense relationship that future cooperation in battlefield preservation and education can be accomplished.

The Portland Community Center & Buffington Island Civil War Museum has raised money and installed a new roof over the museum. They have recently received a \$3,000 grant from the Ohio Humanities Council and a donation of \$1,000 from the Morgan's Men Association to finish work on the museum. They have collected books, research materials, photographs and local artifacts for the museum and have built an interactive map of Meigs County to show the route of Morgan's Raid in that county. The work on constructing more displays began this week and the museum is scheduled to open to the public prior to the Morgan's Raid reenactment on August 26, 2006. They have requested assistance in the form of a donation of a 34-star 3'x5' US flag. [Therefore, I would like to make a motion that the Ohio Department purchase a 34-star United States flag for donation to this museum to representing the Union forces that fought at Buffington Island]. They are also always looking for grant-writing assistance in obtaining more funding. Efforts are currently underway to mark the Gen. John Hunt Morgan Heritage Trail to increase tourist opportunities to the area and educate the public on Buffington Island. In addition, the Ohio Historical Society has taken a new interest in the Buffington Island State Park and has removed damaged and rundown signage. They have recently repaired the two stone monuments in the park and made other park improvements. The park's appearance is markedly better.

I want to especially recognize Brother Jim Oiler, members of the Cadot-Blessing #126 Camp and Myla Raymond, President of the Portland Community Center and Buffington Island Civil War Museum, for their assistance this past year. I also wanted to give my undying appreciation to the members of my Gen. Benjamin D. Fearing Camp #2 Camp for their constant help and support in all of my endeavors.

I want to encourage all brothers and camps to attend the wreath-laying ceremony at Buffington Island State Park on July 22, 2006 at 1:00pm. Following the ceremony, there will be a luncheon for all participants and a tour of the adjacent Buffington Island Civil War Museum detailed above. It is important that we continue to remember the Boys in Blue that helped repel the Confederate invasion of Ohio at our state's only major Civil War battlefield.

Finally, I will submit the following Non-Buffington Island related events that I participated in from the 2005 Ohio Department Encampment to the present:

- Helped organize the marker dedication on July 30, 2005 for Thomas Jefferson Wilcoxon, last surviving Civil War veteran of Washington County, OH. Comrade Wilcoxon was a Private in the 191st Ohio Volunteer Infantry, Company B who died on July 12, 1940. I spoke about his unit's service and about his family genealogy. Pvt. Wilcoxon's only surviving grandson was present and given the honor of unveiling the marker to the public. Following the unveiling, I participated in the firing of a rifle salute to Comrade Wilcoxon and ordered the firing of an artillery salute by the Kanawha Artillery of St. Mary's, WV to all of those Civil War veterans he represented as its last survivor.

- Participated in the 2nd Annual Civil War Living History event at Wyngate Senior Living Community in Vienna, WV.

- Gave two separate presentations on Washington County in the Civil War to the Washington County Historical Society.

- Marched in the 2005 Veteran's Day Parade in Marietta, OH.

- Helped organize funeral plans for Real Son, Claremont Deem, and participated in firing a rifle salute to this beloved brother of my camp.

- Attended the July 4, 2006 Lion's Club all day celebration at Beverly, OH where our camp set up a living history display and interacted with the public.

- Organized and oversaw the School Day event at the Marietta Reenactment in September 2005. Members of my camp and I set up our officer tent and living history display. Our camp gave presentations to hundreds of grade school children on equipment and the life of Union soldiers. I related various stories about local Civil War veterans from Washington County during that event. We also continued these activities throughout the three day event to continue to educate the public and recruit new SUVCW members.

- Named 2006 Citizen of the Year by the Civitan Club of Marietta for my work as Director of the Community Food Pantry in Marietta, Past Commander and member of the Benjamin D. Fearing Camp #2 SUVCW, President of the Washington County Historical Society, member of the Marietta Mayor's Monument Committee, helping to start a Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution in Marietta this past year and for various other activities in Marietta and the surrounding county.

- Have been working with members of Marietta Mayor Michael Mullen's Monuments Committee to catalog all of the city's monuments, markers, mounds, etc. into a comprehensive database. We are currently working on ways of promoting the city's numerous markers and plaques into various tours for visitors. I will be working to develop one specifically on Civil War sites throughout the town.

-Marched with my SUVCW Camp Color Guard in the Memorial Day Parade in Harmar, OH and participated in the VFW ceremony following the parade in Harmar Cemetery. Following that ceremony, we honored the US Navy veterans from all wars in a ceremony on the Putnam Street Bridge separating Marietta and Harmar. I then spoke in a joint ceremony with the Elizabeth Rector Buell Tent #19 of Marietta to honor our Union ancestors at the Civil War Monument in Muskingum Park, Marietta, OH and joined the camp color guard in firing a rifle salute to the fallen soldiers, sailors and marines of the Civil War. Following that ceremony, we marched in the Marietta Parade to Oak Grove Cemetery and joined in the American Legion ceremony there. Finally, I traveled to the Portland Community Center in Meigs County where I joined Brother Jim Oiler and member of the Cadot-Blessing Camp #126 of Gallipolis, OH to perform a Memorial Day ceremony near the Buffington Island State Park.

-Developed an index for a our late brother Jerry Barker Devol's Washington County Civil War Card File of nearly 4000 veterans from that county. His card file was digitized by member of the DAR & DUV this past year and will hopefully be available for researchers in the near future. I've also continued work on my computer database of over 6,500 Civil War soldiers, sailors and marines who attended school, were buried in and/or lived at one time in Washington County, OH.

Camp Chase National Cemetery, Columbus, Ohio, contains 2,260 Confederate prisoners graves. These prisoners died between 1862 and 1865. Some after the war officially ended because they were too sick to be moved from the prison hospital.

The cemetery is a well kept and preserved National Cemetery. Every grave stone, stone wall and main gate are in excellent condition. Within the stone walls are large oak trees.

The Annual Memorial Ceremony is held on the first Sunday of June at 3:00 p.m. The ceremony is planned and held by the Hilltop Historical Society, Columbus, Ohio. The color guard and members of Governor William Dennison Camp #1, S.U.V.C.W. attend and participate in this ceremony. Carrying on the tradition set forth by the local Grand Army of the Republic Posts of Franklin County, Ohio.

For further reading and information you may purchase a reprinted book from the Blue & Grey Magazine. The title is "Story of Camp Chase" Author William H. Knauss. Captain Knauss of the union army and a member of the Grand Army of the Republic caused the cemetery to be preserved and seen to it that flowers sent from the south were placed on the graves.

Someday you might well be in a cemetery after you leave this world and just maybe someone will put a flag on your grave, when they notice you do not have one.
